VVA 1054 has approved a new committee/ministry. It is called Vietnam Vets Visiting Vets, VVVV or 4Vs. The mission of this ministry is to visit all the vets in nursing homes in our nine county area, on a weekly basis.

To accomplish this, we will need volunteers from these nine counties to be trained and then assigned to an individual vet, which the volunteer will visit once a week for an hour. I know this is a lofty goal, and that you can't always visit your vet every week but that is the goal. We can only do our best. Two or three times a month is much better than not at all. The sad fact is that the vets in nursing homes often never get a visit from anyone. We can change that. Some of us will be there ourselves one day, unfortunately. Notes from Todd Rose (Veterans Service Officer for Codington County)

Just a quick reminder that your local VSO can help with Compensation, Pension claims, Burial claims, educational benefits, VA Health Care enrollment, State benefits, and general questions regarding military or veteran issues We are here to assists and educate veterans and their families of possible VA benefits.

VA Pension (income based) is one benefit that can have a huge impact for a veteran or dependent if they are financially challenged, living on a limited income. If you are or know someone that might be, please stop by or tell them to contact our office. With a few questions we can get an idea if you are eligible and could qualify. I have found that VA



pension benefits can be especially beneficial to qualified veterans or dependents that are living in nursing homes or assisted living because their medical living expenses are more than their income. This can also be a benefit for

someone that is on Medicaid.

With Memorial Day soon approaching, here is an opportunity to show veteran status on a privately purchased headstone. Please help spread the word to families of deceased veterans. The Medallion is only for eligible deceased Veterans who served in the Armed Forces on or after April 6, 1917, regardless of their date of death.

Furnished upon receipt of claim for

affixing to an existing privately purchased headstone or marker placed at the graveside of an eligible deceased Veteran who is buried in a private or local Government cemetery. The medallion is inscribed with the word VETERAN across the top and the Branch of Service at the bottom. An eligible deceased Veteran may receive a government furnished headstone or marker, or medallion, **but not both.**

It can be submitted by an individual using the form VA-Form 40-1330M which can be found on line or if they need assistance they can stop by their local VSO office and get help to complete it.

Chapter 1054 Honored at South Dakota State Capital

The South Dakota House of Representatives and Senate, both recognized the Vietnam Veterans of American Chapter 1054 in their opening session Wednesday afternoon, February 16. 2022.

Representative Nancy York introduced House Commemoration 8002 commending and honoring them for their philanthropy, military funeral honors, flag donations, and honoring health care workers.

Senator Larry Zikmund highlighted all the great things this Chapter has done in their region and throughout the State.

The Chapter is the twelfth largest of the six hundred and fifty active chapters in the

United States, with more than five hundred veteran members and over seventy associate members.







The Western Guard in Minnesota wrote an article about the beginning of Chapter 1054. Below is part of the article telling us where we started as to where we are today.

Keeping watch over one another, VVA Chapter 1054 has created a community for local Vietnam Veterans.

Returning from any war or conflict is draining on a soldier, and it was harsh for Vietnam Veterans as they were treated poorly by the public and other soldiers from previous wars. According to Phil Braeger, "As for the divide between veterans organization and the Vietnam Veterans, a lot of it was based on "winning" the war, they never looked into their mind that we did not go over there to "win the war", but to give the South Vietnamese the ability and knowledge and equipment to be able to eventually be able to fight and win their own with our logistical support. In other words, it was our job to train them and keep the enemy at bay until the South Vietnamese military were able to take over the job and secure their own country,"

They were treated poorly by the public, who would ridicule them and not allow them to take part in other

veterans groups. Because of that, Vietnam Veterans banded together to provide for one another and help give to their communities.

This is what started the formation of the Vietnam Veterans of America with one the closest-before Watertown's chapter was created-was in St. Cloud. That was where David Jerpseth began his time as a member of the VVA.

"I was a Vietnam Veteran of America at large in Minnesota, and was totally impressed with their magazine. There was no chapter close by, closest was St. Cloud. I called the national office and asked about South Dakota, Sioux Falls was the closest. I then called the Sioux Falls chapter and told his what my goal was to start another chapter in either Brookings or Wtn, and when he heard that, he was very much on board. His desire to put the level of effort needed to create a new chapter was in an effortto honor his first cousin who passed away, DeWayne Bliss. "My first cousin died of Agent Orange the day after Thanksgiving in 2010.

He was like an older brother to me" Dave said, I wanted to do something to honor him"

We set up a night to talk to members about starting a chapter, handing out application forms to everyone that attended. "All we needed was 25 to start a chapter, I think we got a few turned in that night and another meeting was the next night. Several guys came back for the second meeting, probably 15, and there was interest." In those two nights they received more than half the applications needed. A third meeting was held around the first part of April 2011 at a local casino where around 50 showed up. "That was a huge turn out," said Jerpseth. "I wasn't done yet, so we had our turn in meeting at the Elks on April 15. They were standing in line to turn in their applications, with 15 people in line as were coming in the door..

With already over 100 members John Rowen, of Maryland, the National President came to Fargo in May to present us Chapter status.

Jerpseth served as President for the first year, and the group worked well together despite any

issues that might have come up. "Don Reconnu and I were the ones who helped get this started. He was creative and very logical, coming up with lots of ideas to help better the club. And he was adamant about getting them done."

Because of that effort, Reconnu was honored with the VVA Member of the Year Nationally in 2013.

Now there are over 500 members, and they continue to look out for one another and do what we can for their communities.

For Flag Day, the group organized and scheduled people to stand outside businesses and hand out flags...problem was we ran out of flags before noon. Ever since we've been able to raise money with a donation kettle and continue to pass out the flags. This was one of our first activities. Every activity we've done allows the members a better chance to get to know one another better.

And so we are here, we are here today....with many activities and many new friendships and awarded the National Chapter of the Year.
