(Veterans Service Officer for Codington & Hamlin County)

Well, I hope that everyone had a great year and is getting ready for another trip around the Sun. It has

been a busy year at the office. We have processed over 430 claims for veterans and dependants and these claims have brought just shy of 3 million dollars in new federal funds, going to veterans and dependants in our local communities. The VA hit a peak of filing over 11,000 claims per day, for several days in September

of this year. A lot of these claims were generated in part to the recently passed "Honor the Pact Act" in August of 2022.

The passing of the Honor the Pact Act law opened new areas for Agent Orange exposure and new presumptive conditions for Vietnam veterans and their dependants. It also added the consideration due to toxic exposure for different military job skills, to include additional presumptive conditions for Gulf War and post 9/11 veterans.

We just can't share the knowledge of potential benefits to all the veterans and their dependants. Please help us spread the word to get veterans and their dependants to stop in and see their local VSO. Just to have a conversation about benefits and about it. So, please help us spread the word and let's get those veterans, that might not be part of an organization like the VVA in touch with their local VSO. That way if they are eligible and qualify for benefits, they can start the process. The current process takes on average 180 days from when the VA gets a claim to when it is completed. That is what the VA states. I would say it takes more. Thank you for your service and have a great day.

The Veteran's Service Officer provides expert claims service to every eligible Codington & Hamlin Veterans and his/her dependants and survivors: to aid the veteran in understanding entitlements, which can minimize the burden of health and economic stress; to process the necessary forms for Federal as well as State Veteran Benefits.


2024 Christmas Party

National Membership Report

The October membership numbers are in and we continue to increase our Membership beyond the 92,000 members mark. As of October 2024, the VVA has a total of 92,256 members including 1,478 women Veterans. In October, the VVA welcomed 227 new members, and unfortunately, we lost 76 members.

The Membership Affairs Committee report for Oct shows a steady growth in the VVA membership. While some regions and states experienced declines, the overall trend is positive, with notable increases in several key areas. The committee continues to monitor and support membership growth and retention efforts across the regions.

Remember there are 6.6 million Vietnam veterans living in America and abroad. That is 16% of the US Population. 44% male=23 million, 1 in every 3 males are 65+ years of age.

Our Chapter has 498 VVA members and 81 AVVA members. Each time we meet up with a VV we need to invite them to join our Chapter. For more information on our membership contact Dennis Solberg or use the membership form in this newsletter.
